

Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct

- 1. I/We pledge to provide positive support, care, and encouragement for our children participating with TCMBA and all other children participating in the sport of baseball.
- 2. I/We will encourage good sportsmanship through demonstrating and providing respect for all players, coaches, umpires, parents and the public at large at all games, practices and events.
- 3. I/We will place the emotional and well-being of our children ahead of any personal desire to win.
- 4. I/We will demand a drug, alcohol and smoke-free sports environment for our children and all children participating in the sport of baseball.
- 5. I/We must always remember that the game and the experience is primarily for the children and secondary for the adults.
- 6. I/We will encourage and teach our children to always treat all players, coaches, parents, fans and officials with respect.
- 7. I/We will encourage and promote a team spirit and will endeavour to have our children attend all games, practices and events related to the baseball season.
- 8. I/We will discuss any differences with coaches, fans and officials away and distant from all children in a calm and dignified manner.
- 9. I/We understand that the coach is in charge and has the position of authority over the children during games, practices and events. Note: Parents should immediately intervene should an issue arise that concerns the immediate safety or security of their children.
- 10. I/We will always remember to set an exemplary example in all respects of the sport of baseball for the children.
- 11. I/We will not accept or participate in bullying of any player, coach, official, or other parent physically, verbally, or emotionally.
- 12. I/We will not communicate via mass email (and other social media methods) to the other team families without the text first being approved by the Head Coach.
- 13. I will raise any issues that I have in accordance with the TCMBA Dispute Resolution Policy.
